Saturday 23 May RULES OF THE DAY

To be eligible to enter your catch online you MUST pre-register your details at <u>www.fishingcomp.co.nz</u> Once registered, join the group 'Nauti 2019'

Low Tide 1348hrs, 0.8m High Tide 0748hrs, 3.0m

1. General Information

You are welcome to take home your legal sized catch, however anglers are 'encouraged' to release fish so that they swim away on their own and in good condition. Fish are best removed from the water with a rubber mesh net. Wet your hands before carefully placing the fish on the measuring mat for photographing. You can then release the fish by placing it back in the net and returning to the water or use wet hands to release. Please do not use a towel or rag, either wet or dry as this removes the protective slime and makes the fish susceptible to infection. Do not place your fingers in the gills of fish you intend to release. Fish can be revived by moving it forward in the water to ensure a healthy release.

2. Species

Snapper, Kahawai and 'Other Species' (as determined on the <u>www.fishingcomp.co.nz</u> leaderboards. (ALL FISH MUST BE OVER THEIR LEGAL SIZE LIMIT TO ENTER). No sharks, rays or eels will be entered.

<mark>4. Method</mark>

The catch being entered must have been caught on a rod and reel and are encouraged to be released! No gaffs are permitted! If the fish is injured and will not survive, common sense should prevail. WE ARE TRYING TO SUPPORT AND ENCOURAGE CATCH AND RELEASE FISHING.

5. Measuring Device and Requirements

- a) All fish must be measured on a flat surface with an 'Official Measure' which includes any measure that has been formally approved by NZ Fishing Comp. Read all the rules and view the official measures here http://www.fishingcomp.co.nz/rules
- b) A 'competition code' will be announced on the morning of the Competition. This MUST be written (in felt or whiteboard marker) on your competition card (provided with your boat

bag). This is to be displayed in your photograph on the 'top-left' corner on your 'Official Measure'. The unique code will be available on the OBC Info Line (0800 622 462) at 0500hrs on the morning of the competition. You must retrieve this competition code to be eligible to enter your catch online! (See more in section 6 below)

6. Registration Process

- a) Register at <u>www.fishingcomp.co.nz</u> make sure to use the code 'DB Export' and it's FREE!
- b) Once registered, login to the site
- c) Click on the tab 'leaderboards'. Under 'Join a Leaderboard', type' Nauti' then search to join the group
- d) Click join. The administrator will need to approve your application. Once that's done you'll see the Nauti Girls logo appear in 'Groups I belong to' under the dropdown, under your name. Now you're able to load your catches

7. Things to Note

- All team members (including the 'Bait Master') must be in Fancy Dress costume for the evening function
- Theme for 2020 is "Edible Anglers"
- The 'Bait Master' CAN NOT FISH this event (only if they are female). The Bait Master's role is to bait, hook, clean and cater to the ladies for the day
- Only pre-paid guests will be given entry for the evening
- If the Fishing is cancelled due to bad weather, the evening event will still go ahead in the Club Room and prizes will be randomly drawn (see cancellation details set out below)
- All profits will be donated to the childrens charity 'Make-A-Wish'
- Skippers must formulate their own rules about the distribution of prizes. The club will not be involved in any disputes. All decisions regarding the allocation of prizes by the Club are final

8. Online Photo Entries

- Uploads from 1100hrs close off at 1600hrs
- There will be a measure station outside the OBC office for anyone having difficulty measuring
- Upload your longest ONE (ONLY) of each species: Snapper, Kahawai or 'Other Species' at the end of your fishing day. On land is often easier than at sea, where reception can be sparse
- Plenty of time to go home and get your outfit on ready for the party

9. Evening Timeline

- 1730hrs Doors/bar open
- 1800hrs Buffet dinner and dessert. All guests to be seated at their tables (no late arrivals please)
- 1900hrs Prize giving begins
- 2000hrs DJ plays until 2200hrs

CANCELLATION OF FISHING ONLY

If wind is forecast to be over 20 knots in the Waitemata Harbour. If in doubt Phone OBC Information line 0800 622 462 (OBC Inc). THERE IS NO RAIN DATE FOR THIS EVENT.
